

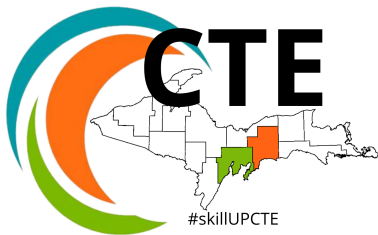

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Delta-Schoolcraft I.S.D. Career and Technical Education Honor Society Guidelines

Have you:

- ☐ Completed at least three quarters of the current school year in a CTE program.
- ☐ Had six or fewer excused absences per semester.
- ☐ Achieved a grade of "A" in your CTE program in each of the first three quarters of the school year.
- ☐ Committed to maintain your grade of "A" through the end of the school year.
- ☐ Volunteered at least 10 hours with non-profit community organizations during the current school year.

If so, you may qualify for induction into the CTE Honor Society by completing the following:

1. Volunteer at least 10 hours with non-profit organizations if you have not already done so.
2. Ask for and receive a recommendation from your CTE teacher.
3. Fill out the application form.
4. Submit 2 or 3 digital JPEG pictures of yourself attached to your application or by email attachment to Mr. Roland at mroland@dsisd.net such as:
 - o Photo doing volunteer work in the community
 - o Photo doing a hands-on activity in your CTE class or at your CTE worksite
 - o Photo doing an after-school job or a hobby you enjoy

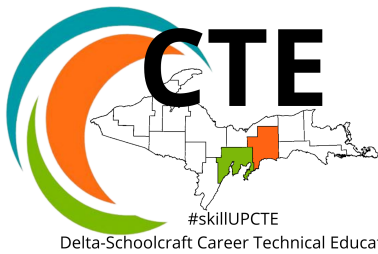
Photos could be used for such things as the honor society induction ceremonies, at an I.S.D. School Board presentation, with a newspaper article about the honor society, at the spring awards banquet, or for other purposes.

Honor Society members often help in positions of responsibility such as membership in the CTE Tour Guide Team, serving as advisory council members for their CTE program, acting as ambassadors for the I.S.D. and the Career and Technical Education department, and assisting instructors when needed.

Submit the application form, documentation of community service and your photos by
Thursday, March 23, 2023

Applications will be reviewed by a committee of CTE staff and administrators. Students will be informed whether or not they were selected to be in the Honor Society.

Inductees will receive a letter of recommendation from CTE Director, Mr. Trent Bellingar and their CTE Honors Society certificate at the spring awards ceremony on **Thursday, May 4** at the Escanaba Senior High School auditorium at 7:00 pm.

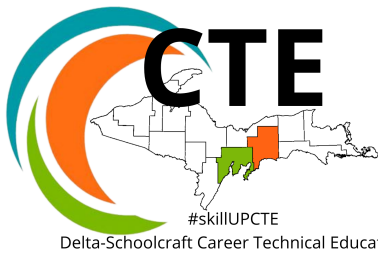
